FISCAL YEAR 2025-2026 GRANT FUNDING OPPURTUNITIES

CARL MOYER PROGRAM

California’s strategic plans for air quality and mobility, including the State Implementation Plan and the Sustainable Freight Action Plan, point to the need for combustion engines to transition to zero and near zero emission alternatives. This move is critical to California’s clean air mission, to the attainment of the health-based air quality standards, and to meeting future transportation goals without harm to public health and the environment. Public incentives funds are an increasingly important part of this transition. Incentives both encourage customers to purchase cleaner technologies and stimulate the marketplace to manufacture cleaner technologies.

The Carl Moyer Memorial Air Quality Standards Attainment Program (“Carl Moyer Program”) is a grant program that funds the incremental cost of cleaner-than-required engines, equipment, and other sources of air pollution.

The North Coast Unified Air Quality Management District (“NCUAQMD”) will allocate \$450,000 for Fiscal Year 2025-2026 to fund the following project types:

- Marine Vessel Repower
- Off-Road Mobile Equipment Replacement, e.g., agricultural, construction, and industrial equipment
- Infrastructure projects that fuel or power a covered source as defined by Health and Safety Code section 44275(a)(7) and include, but are not limited to, on-road (including light-duty), offroad, agricultural, and marine vessel emission sources. Please contact District Staff to discuss other potential infrastructure projects.
