

INCENTIVE GRANT FUNDING

NCUAQMD 22'-23' CARL MOYER PROGRAM



The California Air Resources Board has determined that pollution created by diesel powered engines represents a significant health risk. Additional regulations will be implemented over the next several years which are designed to reduce or eliminate this risk. Owners of medium and heavy-duty equipment including agricultural tractors, trucks, loaders, dozers, cranes, and marine vessels will be required to purchase new vehicles or make substantial modifications to existing equipment.

The Carl Moyer Memorial Air Quality Standards Attainment Program (Carl Moyer Program) is a grant program that funds the replacement of older gross polluting engines and machinery with new cleaner-than-required engines and equipment. The North Coast Unified Air Quality Management District (NCUAQMD) has allocated \$500,000 for the 2022-2023 cycle to fund replacement projects for equipment in the following categories:

Off-Road Projects – Cranes, Dozers, Earth Movers, Agricultural Tractors etc.

- Replacement of equipment powered by uncontrolled engines with new units
- Repower – Installation of new engines in existing units

Marine Projects – Engine Repower of Commercial Fishing Vessels

The District will accept hand delivered (drop off box at Office) or postmarked applications beginning May 1, 2022 through May 31, 2022.
